COVID-19 vaccination program: A small but steady supply of COVID-19 vaccines continues to be available to MTHCS, so please confirm your eligibility and then phone either the Ouyen or Sea Lake medical centre to book an appointment. To check if you are eligible, visit www.covidvaccine.healthdirect.gov.au/eligibility. If you have any concerns about the vaccine, please discuss these with

Is it true? A lot of people have questions about the COVID-19 vaccines. Here's some commonly asked questions and answers:

Why do I have to wait 14 days between getting the flu and COVID-19 vaccine?

It is recommended that people wait at least 14 days between a dose of seasonal flu vaccine and a dose of the COVID-19 vaccine. The 14-day time frame is a precautionary measure to manage the common side effects that come with many vaccinations.

Can COVID-19 vaccines give you COVID-19?

None of the approved vaccines in Australia contain the live virus. This means they cannot give you COVID-

If the vaccine is safe, why can't kids have it?

At this stage, neither the Pfizer nor the AstraZeneca COVID-19 vaccines have approval for use in children from the Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) because there are limited clinical trial results showing that the vaccines are effective and safe in these age groups.


