COVID-Safe Christmas: To keep yourself and your loved ones safe this Christmas, remember to keep following the COVID-Safe Summer regulations. In summary:

- You must carry a face mask with you when you leave home.
- Wearing a face mask is only mandatory while in taxis or ride share vehicles, on public transport, or when going to large retail venues, including shopping centres, supermarkets and department stores.
- Wearing a face mask is strongly recommended indoors and outdoors when you can't keep 1.5 metres distance from other people.


