COVID-19 testing: COVID-19 testing continues to be available at our Ouyen medical clinic but you MUST phone ahead (phone 5092 1168). Testing is available for members of our local community who are symptomatic or have been to a known exposure site. To check the latest exposure sites, visit www.coronavirus.vic.gov.au/exposure-sites

Close contacts of COVID-19 cases: A close contact is someone who has been identified by the Department of Health contract tracers as having spent time with someone who has COVID-19. There is a high chance that people who have been close to someone with COVID-19 will get the virus and spread it to other people. There are two types of close contacts:

<u>Primary close contacts:</u> someone who has had face-to-face contact or spent time in a closed space with someone who has COVID-19 while they were infectious; or someone who has been in an outbreak or other setting where there is a higher risk of transmission of COVID-19.

<u>Secondary close contacts:</u> someone who has had face-to-face contact with a primary close contact at least 24 hours after them being exposed to COVID-19.

It's important to note, **you must** quarantine if you have been identified by the Department of Health as a primary or secondary close contact. People who are determined to be close contacts will be contacted by the department. However, if you think you have been to a public exposure site during a period of concern you should contact the department.
